### This Issue: OOPs, not 'Oops!'

Welcome to the winter edition of the GRANT newsletter! With deadlines around the corner, this quarter we are focusing on Out Of Programme Research (OOPR) experiences. These play an important role in embedding a 'research culture' in our region and developing research–active consultants for the future. Read on for inspiration and tips!

IMPORTANT: Remember that the deadline for OOP applications is the end of February, so any adverts or applications for 2025/26 should be well underway. Trainees should let the TPD (currently Dr Bevan – roisin.bevan@nhs.net) know your plans as soon as possible and supervisors should ensure funding/approvals etc. are in place.

#### Tips for planning an OOPR

When applying for (or supervising) an OOPR, is it important to consider the ways in which fellowships vary. Things that work well for one trainee or supervisor may not be ideal for others. Whilst far from an exhaustive list, these are good starting points to consider:

When? There is no right or wrong time, but consider current level of experience, endoscopy sign off, exams, etc. How much training/supervision/study leave is appropriate?

How long? OOPs are generally 1–3 years and duration will affect what can be achieved. For trainees, does prolonging your training fit with your other life plans?

<u>What project?</u> Is the project something you are interested in? Is adequate expertise available in the supervisory team? Is it set up/is data available? If not, is the planned time-frame and workload feasible?

Qualifications and degrees? If a qualification will be completed, is funding available or would it be self funded? What level – e.g. PGCert vs PhD? How will this impact the split between academic and clinical time?

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# Benefits of going OOP as a trainee: Dr David Beaton

Dr Beaton is now a consultant at Northumbria, but completed his registrar training in the region.
During this time he did an OOPR and was also a member of the GRANT committee. Here's what he had to say about his OOPR experience:



'I completed my out of programme (OOP) in North Tees, spending three years as an endoscopy fellow. My job role was split 50:50 between clinical and research, meaning each week I undertook four endoscopy lists (including a weekly inpatient list) alongside a clinic which mainly consisted of IBD patients. The other five sessions were designated to research time and were self-directed, allowing the flexibility to work from home when appropriate. I loved my OOP time, the flexibility and ability to arrange my own diary prepared me for consultant life, while the endoscopy and IBD experience meant when I came back into training, I was confident in mu abilities. The research side was also rewarding, not only completing my own project, but allowing me to meet colleagues around the country and start working with them on other interesting projects. To anyone considering going OOP I would strongly advise it.'
